What a Typical Club Looks Like:

- Starts with snack time
- Songs 6 minutes
- Bible Lesson 15 to 18 minutes
- Lesson Review Game 10 minutes
- Memory Verse 10 minutes
- Missions Story 10 minutes
- WonderTime reflection on lesson
