Our Rich History



Child Evangelism Fellowship was established in 1937 and has grown into the largest evangelistic outreach to children in the world. CEF was founded by Jesse Irvin Overholtzer who, at age 12, was convicted of his sin and sought counsel from a family member who told him that he was "too young." It wasn't until college that Mr. Overholtzer heard the Gospel and trusted Christ as his Savior. Later as a pastor he read one of Charles Spurgeon's sermons which stated, "A child of five, if properly instructed, can as truly believe and be regenerated as an adult." The Lord used this statement in Mr. Overholtzer's life along with the influence of Dwight L. Moody and others to lead him to begin the ministry at age 60 in Chicago, Illinois.

The first and largest ministry of CEF is Good News Club. Clubs began back in the age of flannel graphs and were mostly held in homes and churches. The ministry had to adapt to the changing American lifestyle as more women entered the work force and were not home to hold clubs after school. "Go where the children are" led to looking into having clubs in public schools after school hours and in June, 2001 the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that CEF has access to public school buildings after school just as any other outside organization would. Today there are over 6,000 Good News Clubs in the U.S. alone.
