

Prior to Covid, there were a number of clubs that met for years under the leadership of Katrina Lewis from Faith Bible Church on Kemper Road. Katrina moved out-of-state in 2020 and there were no Mason clubs until now.

Anna Bogan, also from Faith Bible Church, felt the Lord prompting her to bring it back. Anna has five children in Mason schools and she is the leader of the school district's Moms in Prayer group. Anna has been involved in youth ministry for years and her experience paid off with having such a large group. She says, "It has been humbling to see what God can do with simple obedience. Persevering through challenges and spiritual warfare

As easy as it was to work with the Mason City School District, working with schools and community centers in the Middletown area was exceptionally challenging. Sometimes we received the silent treatment where phone calls and emails were not returned while in another case the principal said he is leary of hosting us because we may attract organizations that the school and parents may not want to be there. (He *may* be alluding to the After-School Satan Club that came to Lebanon in 2022.) In another instance at a community after-school childcare location, a woman from the center announced that it was time for a bathroom break just when the Bible lesson started so club was interrupted and hard to get back on track.

Because of this, Rocky learned about the impact club had on Carter and how his faith took him through a severe medical crisis over the summer and how Carter's faith affected the entire family.





Carter is now in third grade and part of the Good News Club at Donovan Elementary School in Lebanon. His siblings are in clubs, as well, and the parents are on a faith journey themselves. Dad had never been in a church and Carter's step mom hasn't been in church since she was a child. All that is changing now and we got to learn what the Lord is doing through CEF.
