## **STATISTICS**

Eighteen Good News Clubs ministering to 784 children, an increase of four more clubs and 202 more children over 2023.





Three summer county fairs reaching 1,253 children, teens and adults with the Gospel which is an increase of two more fairs and 806 more people reached over 2023.

Twenty-six Christmas parties reaching 360 kids. This is an increase of six parties and 62 more children reached compared to 2023.



113 children reached during spring and fall, and back to school events.25 children were part of summertime 3-Day Clubs.

God blessed us this year with three part-time staff. Paul Adams is the Fair/Festival Coordinator and his wife, Lauren Adams, is the Christmas Party Club Coordinator. Anna Snyder is a Good News Club Starter.
